POWER OF A PURSE

The Women's Fund of the Kenosha Community Foundation held its Power of Purse event on Nov. 4. The event was a sell-out – with over 300 attending. Counting ticket sales, sponsorships and the auction of purses (many filled with "surprises") and purse like items, the event raised over \$21,000 to benefit the Women's Fund.

On Nov. 16, during Community Foundation week, the Foundation worked with two of its non-profit organization partners in Kenosha. (KAFASI), and the Kenosha Public Museums Foundation, hosted "Mapping your Future" at the Civil War Museum – an informational breakfast that covered some of the basics and options involved in estate planning and wealth management.

SCUPTURE WALK-HARBORPARK INSTALLATION

The Arts Fund of the Kenosha Community Foundation completed the installation of Kenosha's newest attraction – Sculpture Walk-HarborPark. The nine sculptures chosen for its inaugural installation make Sculpture Walk-HarborPark, the largest outdoor public art project in Kenosha's history.

The artists were commissioned to exhibit their original sculptures for two years and received a \$1,000 honorarium for each year of the exhibit. The project is privately funded through sponsorships by businesses and organizations in the Kenosha community and supporters of the Arts Fund.
