





Kenosha Community Foundation turns donations into opportunities

This week's featured organization is the Kenosha Community Foundation. Executive Director Robert Schneider provided the answers.

Q: What is the mission of your organization?

A: The Kenosha Community Foundation is a tax-exempt public charity that manages permanent philanthropic endowment funds. From these endowments, the foundation annually awards grants to not-for-profit organizations for programs that are responsive to community needs and scholarships to local students.

Q: Who are the leaders of your organization?

A: The board of directors includes President Kenneth Fellman, along with Neil Guttormsen, Victor Weiler, Jane Harrington Heide, Cathryn Bothe, Marsha Caporaso, David Geertsen, Jack Harris, J. Michael McTernan, Joan Wilk and Jamie Young. The honorary board of advisers includes Elynor Chemerow, Robert Cornog, Mary Enroth, Samuel Seavitte and Gene Soens.

Q: How and when did it get its start?

A: The foundation was established in 1926 and has been in continuous service ever since.

Q: What kinds of support do you need from the community?

A: We look to individuals and organizations to create new endowment funds.

Here's how that works:

Individuals, families, businesses and organizations donate to the foundation with cash, securities, real estate, bequests, trusts and numerous other methods. With the donation, the foundation and the donor(s) sign an agreement and create a permanent charitable fund. The Foundation then manages and invests the money.

With a percentage of the income earned by the fund, the foundation (with input from donors and members of the local community) identifies current and emerging issues, (and) distributes the proceeds of

the fund into the community through grants to nonprofit organizations and scholarships to area students.

Q: What's your next event or effort?

A: We will award grants in the fall from our field of interest funds which include the LaFave Family Fund, OMC Legacy Fund, Women's Fund and the Arts Fund.


